ARRIVING TIME - Please be on time for school. All students should be at school ready for the day by 8:15am. Being ready for the day means sitting in your classroom with everything organized for the day. Being late causes your child to be behind and rushed all day and disrupts the classroom. We will be meeting with families where tardiness is a pattern to help support making good habit changes to fix this important issue.



STUDENT DROP OFF - If you are dropping off students in a car please do so on the side of the building on Savoie Drive and not in the front parking lot in order to keep our walking students safe. Parents can never park in the fire lane in front of the school for safety reasons.



BREAKFAST PROGRAM/MAGICAL MORNINGS Any student interested in having breakfast, (toast, cereal, and juice) is invited anytime between **7:55 and 8:10 am**. Students are to go to their classroom first to drop off their school bags. If they chose not to have breakfast, students are expected to go to the gym for a Magical Morning walk. We would welcome parent volunteers for breakfast preparation. Please contact the school if interested. Students cannot go for breakfast after 8:10 as there is not enough time eat and to be in their class for 8:15. They can pick up "breakfast to go" from the office after 8:10 a.m.

HEAD LICE - Please check your child's hair on a regular basis for head lice. This is the time of year when children pass this to each other. We also do a check at school on a regular basis. **If your child is sent home with head lice, once your child is treated and the nits are removed a parent is to bring their child to the office to have their head rechecked and stay with them until they have permission to return to class.**



SAFE ARRIVAL Service to families:

*Please call the school if your child will be absent or arriving late (after 8:15 a.m. students are considered late for school). If leaving a message please state your child's name, teacher's name, date and reason they are absent. A safe arrival call will be made if we have not heard from you or you have not sent the teacher in a note the day before. Please have your child **SIGN THE CLIPBOARD** at the office if they arrive late before going to class. This will avoid a safe arrival call to the home. It is very important to keep your child's contact #'s up to date at all times.*
