Partitioning Numbers

Not sure what your child means when they talk about partitioning numbers? It is just a way of thinking of a number in parts. In the early grades children are taught to see a number as being made up of many parts. 7 is the same amount as 5 and 2, 6 and 1, or 4 and 3. In the older grades children are partitioning larger number. 546 can be thought of as 500+40+6 or 500+20+20+5+1. As children practice and become more flexible with partitioning numbers they will begin to select partitions that will help them solve math problems mentally.

Mental Maths Partifioning Strategy

When we add numbers, sometimes it helps to break these numbers up into parts which helps to simplify what is being added.
