Virtual Parent-Teacher December 3rd and 4th

This Fall we are embarking on something completely new – virtual Parent-Teacher.

Please keep in mind some important points prior to 'joining the meeting':

- A quiet, private place is best to have your teacher conference. The teachers may have some information for you that they would be uncomfortable sharing in front of the student and/or their siblings. It is important to remember that these are 'adult conversations'.
- Conferences must stay within the 15-minute limit. If further conversation is necessary, I suggest scheduling another time. Even though conferences are spread out, and there should be 5-minute buffer between appointments, we all know that time can get away from us when we are talking about 'our kids' (both teacher and parent!)
- Online etiquette is that the speaker should use the video mode. This is so much better than a phone call because we can get your facial expressions and tone too. It is so much easier to talk to a face rather than a blank screen.
- Also, very important, if you did not indicate in the 'notes' section of the booking that you wanted a phone call – <u>we are assuming it is</u> <u>a TEAMS appointment</u>. If this is not the case, you must get in touch with the teacher in advance, otherwise she will be waiting for you on TEAMS.
