It is extremely important for your child to read and write over the summer! The Sussex Library offers a Summer Reading Club; taking part in this program is one great way to encourage your children to continue reading during the summer holiday. There are many other ways to engage in reading and writing. Encourage your children to: Take turns reading aloud every day; have them write postcards to family and friends; listen to audio books in the car. Read the same book your child is reading and discuss it. Have your child keep a summer scrapbook – have them tape in souvenirs, pictures, postcards and ticket stubs. Then they can write captions, labels, and detailed descriptions on those items. The scrapbook will give them many ideas to write about when they return to the classroom in the fall.
