This may require you to read the food labels on products, and taking this seriously may prevent a life-threatening experience for another child.



Elf School Information

Elementary Literacy Friends (Elf) is a one-on-one literacy tutoring program that matches a trained volunteer with a Grade 2 student who would benefit from additional literacy support.

Tutoring sessions take place after school for 1 hour, twice a week for 10 weeks. Students take the late dismissal bus home.

Curriculum and resources are designed to provide additional literacy support for Grade 2 students at or above level E. Elf kits provide books from levels E to J. Students beyond level J who would benefit from the program for any reason (to improve reading fluency, word recognition, reading comprehension, confidence, etc.) may be chosen to participate. For this reason, Elf requests the school provide the volunteer with 3-4 books at the student's level and to enable the volunteer to trade books as needed.

The program materials were developed by the NB Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, as well as by literacy teachers around the province. A copy of the training manual can be found at www.elfnb.com.

Elf and the school work together to recruit volunteers, support volunteers through their tutoring experience and show appreciation to volunteers for their commitment.

Elf Responsibilities:

- Provide volunteer training (including Policy 701) lead by literacy specialists who have worked in the N.B. education system.
- Provide the volunteer with all the resources they will need to work with the student.
- Refer the trained volunteers to the school and provide contact information

School Responsibilities:

- Identify the students and obtain parent permission
- Contact the volunteer to arrange a schedule
- Collect the criminal record check and Policy 701 assessment of each volunteer on the first day of volunteering.
- Deside the following.
- Provide the following information to the volunteer
 - School procedure for signing-in
 - Location of the space within the school for volunteer session to take place.
 - Procedure for where child should go after tutoring takes place
 - Any relevant school policies/procedures
 - Name of child and information on the teacher referral form
 - Notify the volunteer on days the student is absent
- Provide student progress feedback to Elementary Literacy Inc. when requested at the end of the volunteer session
