So far, we have had 2 successful days and although we have continued to provide announcements over the intercom this initiative certainly meets the needs of the visual learners in our school. It also, provides parents an opportunity to see and hear what is happening at SES. It should allow parents to have a better understanding of upcoming events and things that are happening at SES. The students are very excited about this and it allows teachers the opportunity to play the video during snack time prior to recess so the students can see and hear the announcements a 2nd time. Our goal is to move to just video announcements since it provides flexibility to teachers. We will continue to play O'Canada and announce birthdays on the intercom at the start of each day. We are unable to announce birthdays using the video process since the videos are being posted to our school website and birthdates are considered information that is to be kept private. You will also notice that the students reading the announcements in the video are not introducing or identifying themselves. Again, this is part of the protection of student information policy that was introduced last year by our province. Our SES news team will be rotational. Our intent is to provide this to our grade 5 students who are seen as positive role models for our younger students. acy activities. ELF provides training, materials, feedback and all of the support necessary for each volunteer to make a positive, lifelong impact not just on a student, but on how that student will contribute to society throughout his or her life.

Volunteers do not need previous teaching experience; only a willingness to help and commit to the ELF requirements.

Following an initial 3-hour training session, the volunteer is matched with a student. The volunteer works with the student for 1 hour at the end of the school day, 2 twice a week for 10 weeks.

What is Mental Fitness?

The Department of Healthy and Inclusive Communities recently distributed copies of the 2014 Resource Calendar for Mental Fitness to schools across our region. The calendar has several suggestions on how we can build upon our own personal sense of competence, autonomy and relatedness as well as that of others. Mental fitness is defined as 'a sense of well-being (positive thoughts and feelings) experienced when our needs for competence (C), autonomy (A) and relatedness (R) are met.'

In the following excerpt from the calendar, we see how the importance of CAR relates to our school and classroom communities: <u>Competence:</u> The community recognizes the strengths and talents of the residents and uses these skills to accomplish common objectives. Residents feel valued and are proud of their accomplishments in the community.

<u>Autonomy</u>: The community listens to the residents and involves them in the process of decision-making. Residents support the decisions taken in the community.

<u>**Relatedness:**</u> Residents are proud to belong to their community; it is a place where they feel supported and encouraged. Residents support each other and nurture strong connections.
