COURSE LEVELS

Open or “O” courses are offered at one level only.

Ex: Physical Geography 110, Ind. Family Dynamics 120

Level 2 are academic/university/college preparatory.

Ex: Music 112, Biology 122

Level 3 are general/college preparatory.

Ex: Modern History 113, English 123

Level 1 are enriched university preparatory.

Ex: English 111, Biology 121



HIGH SCHOOL FRENCH IMMERSION

French Instruction:

- 50% in Grades 9 & 10 (10 courses total)
- 25% in Grades 11 and 12 (5 courses in total)

- **Personal Interest Course 1**

- An opportunity to develop and pursue individual interests with the support of mentors* in the school or community. Examples: a Capstone Project, in-depth study of a specific problem, development of a relevant skill, pursue a life skill such as financial literacy or additional language, etc. Assessment will be outlined as part of the design. *There will have to be a qualified mentor available to work with student

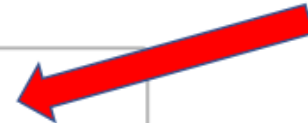
