Students will be writing a final assessment in their courses the week of January 22 – 26th at SRHS, therefore, students are only required to attend for the exam time. If they are not writing an exam and are at school, students are asked to be in the Learning Commons or the assigned classroom for quiet study.

Please note: students are allowed to leave following their exam, but buses are on the regular schedule for this week.

In preparation for exams:

- review and exam preparation tips by subject teachers
- extra help and remediation by subject teachers
- Learning Commons as a quiet space in the morning, at lunch & afterschool until 4:00 pm
- Learning Center (quiet place of study and teacher supervised) every Tuesdays 3:30-4:30 p.m.
- Learning Center Exam Prep from January 8th 19th will run Tuesday and Thursday afternoon
- lunchtime sessions on study/exam skill modules for the following dates:

Exam Expectations:

All students are to come to exam with writing tools (pencil, pen, paper, etc...)

All students must leave all technology silenced or off in their locker or book bag. This includes smart watches.

All students must stay for the minimum of 2 hours provided so they are encouraged to make the most of these 2 hours by checking over the work when they have finished.

Students may bring water to the exam.

Description of the Provincial Assessment that all Grade 9 students write and must pass in order to graduate:

What will the Reading Comprehension component be like?

The Reading Comprehension component is designed to measure student performance in comparison to the Provincial Reading Achievement Standards (end of grade 8) and the Atlantic Canada English Language Arts Curriculum Outcomes (grade 8). In order to ensure that it is fully aligned with our provincial standards, a review committee of NB educators selected the content of the assessment. The format is as follows:

- Literary text (4 passages) and informational text (4 passages);
- Literal questions (20%), inferential/interpretive questions (60%), and personal/critical/evaluative questions (20%);
- 50 selected-response (multiple-choice) items;
- Students will have 90 minutes to complete the component with up to 90 extra minutes, if needed.

The use of dictionaries, thesauri and translation devices are not permitted for the Reading component.
