#### **Heat Alert and Response System**

Extreme heat poses a major health risk to the public, lespecially vulnerable populations like older adults, young children, and the homeless, as well as those with chronic health conditions and those using certain medications.

Further to a federal, provincial and municipal Heat Alert and Response System (HARS) pilot project carried out in Fredericton and three other Canadian communities in the summer of 2010, the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health for New Brunswick (Health Protection Branch) will expand to other larger urban centers across the Province in 2016, with the intent to eventually move the system into all communities in 2017.

The heat alert is based on the Humidex value. Alerts are issued to agencies or organizations that look after vulnerable populations. A variety of actions can be taken to reduce heat stress. The New Brunswick Public Health webpage on HARS is currently under construction and will be available soon.
