Growth Mindset at RES

Ideas for Creating a Growth Mindset Environment at Home

Using Growth Mindset Praise and Feedback

- Praise what your child does, not who they are. Instead of saying, "You are so smart/clever/brilliant," say "I can see you really worked hard/put forth effort/ tried hard." Praise perseverance and resiliency when you see your child struggle or face challenge. Avoid praising grades. Focus on praising work ethic and effort not achievement.
- Adopt the word "yet" into your vocabulary. If your child proclaims that they don't understand something, can't dribble a basketball, or can't play a song on their guitar, remind them that they can't "yet" but with hard work they will have success.
- Avoid comparing your child's success with that of siblings or friends achievement is not a competition. There is enough success for everyone.

Our monthly Growth Mindset theme for November is "Strong Brain".

GREENHOUSE UPDATE:

Our greenhouse is moving along slowly but surely. It now has running water with a sink and hose and we are still waiting for special thermostats to arrive to activate the fans.

We have chosen an inside design and have meetings with a builder on Nov. 1 to get things started. Hopefully the inside will be completed by the end of the month. Once it is complete, our classes will be able to use it regularly.

We are still looking for interested people for the following "jobs":

Greenhouse "council" members to keep it operating for years to come. We need an acting president, secretary and treasurer for a 2 year commitment. This would involve 3 or more virtual meetings per year.

A fundraising committee. Do you have a great idea for a fundraiser? Our greenhouse needs more funds for Phase 2 and we need people to get involved to help raise money.

Grant writers- do you have a special talent in writing grants? If so, we are looking for people to help find and write grants for this project.

Our vision for this Greenhouse is a connection space- where students, teachers, parents, neighbors, and seniors all work together to grow, experiment, connect and communicate.

<u>FLAG POLE REFURBISHMENT</u>- Have you noticed the awesome new look of our flag pole area? Thanks to one of our families for taking the time to sandblast and paint our flagpoles.....it looks SO much better and makes RES look welcoming and warm.

<u>CANTEEN CART</u>- Each Friday some of our peer helpers wheel around a cart to each classroom with canteen goodies for those students who wish to buy a treat. Our aim is to have three different items on the cart each visit. Until Nov. 12 it will have popsicles, sunchips and locally made oatmeal cookies. After the 12th, it will have frozen yogurt tubes, pretzels or baked Lays, and locally made banana bread. All items are \$1 and profits go toward our school greenhouse with the exception of our Oct. 29th cart where profits were donated to UNICEF.
