Let's Communicate

We work very hard at Rothesay Elementary to communicate on a regular basis with parents through our monthly newsletter, school website, e-mail distribution lists, as well as School Messenger voicemails and e-mails. The information given in all phone and e-mail messages sent to RES homes will also be listed on our website. Please check our school website regularly. We are also asking you to fill out the e-mail address field area of the student information forms being sent home with your child. This will enable us to send an electronic copy of the newsletter to you instead of a paper copy to cut down on costs related to photocopying. We will also send out any phone messages by e-mail so that everyone is kept updated and informed about everything happening at RES.

Instructional Time

All public schools in the province follow curricula prescribed by the New Brunswick Department of Education. Curricula expectations are extensive and at RES we must attempt to protect valuable instructional time. Please note that in order for students to be ready to learn, they must be in the building no later than 8:10 AM. Interruptions to the instructional day are to be limited to emergencies.

- If you need to communicate to your child's teacher through the day, please send a note with the information or request a phone call after instructional hours.
- If you are delivering something to your child through the day, please leave the item on the cart inside
 the first set of doors and let the Admin Assistant know who the item is for. Please write your
 child's name on the item as well. The office will see that it is delivered to the classroom ASAP.
- If you must take your child out from the school during instructional hours please call the school to inform
 us you are coming. You can enter the first set of doors and speak to the Admin Assistant through the intercom. The Admin. Assistant will tell your child you have arrived and send him or her to you at the door.
 The Admin. Assistant will sign your child out at the office.

Medication and Health Services, and Custody Information

It is very important that the school is kept informed of any medical or custody concerns with respect to your child. Please be specific when completing the information form that was sent home earlier this week. Please provide your child's teacher with any information on the **Student Information form**. The Dept. of Education requires formal medical information forms for children with a severe medical condition (e.g. severe allergies, diabetes, severe asthma etc., or parents with children who require medication at school). This Health Support and Care form is available at the school office and can be sent home with your child. Please send the Student Information form back to the school ASAP.

Custody information that restricts access to your child can only be put into place if the school has a copy of a court order stating the restricted access.

Scent Free Policy

The School District has a scent free policy. The policy asks all students, employees, volunteers and visitors to refrain from wearing scented products in schools. We ask for complete cooperation and compliance to this policy. It is in the interest of many employees and students that this policy was put in place. We thank you in advance for your cooperation

Calling and Visiting the School

The phone number for the school office is 847-6203. Teachers are always willing to talk with you regarding any concerns you may have about your child's education. The best time to contact teachers is after instructional hours. It is almost impossible for teachers to leave their classrooms unattended during the school day or check their e-mail during instruction. Please, also, be observant of the fact that schools are very busy places. If you wish to see a teacher or administrator at the school, please call and make an appointment, and we will gladly find the time to meet with you virtually or in person with strict guidelines put in place. Dropping in to the school to meet with a teacher or administrator is not an option this year due to Covid19 restrictions.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation with these very important items.

School Policies and Expectations and Parent Handbook 2021-2022

To be environmentally conscious and to cut paper and photocopying costs, paper copies of our 2021-2022 Handbook will not be sent home to parents. The RES Parent Handbook is available to everyone through our school web-site: http://rothesay-elementary.nbed.nb.ca.

Please click on Parent Handbook under parent resources. There is a School Attendance policy outlined in our Parent Handbook that I would ask you to take the time to read. Your child's attendance is very importance to us, everyday and every minute counts in school and is very important that children arrive to school each and every day on time (before 8:15) unless of course they are ill.

Any student who develops two symptoms of COVID 19 will be sent to our isolation room and parents will receive a call to have their child picked up within an hour of the phone call home. This is a Dept. of Education directive to all schools.

If a child arrives at school after 8:15 they are considered late and should enter through the front doors and sign in at the front office with the Admin. Assistant before going to his or her classroom.

Outside Play

Outside play is an even more important part of our day now and all children are encouraged to play and learn outside as much as possible. Our students will be having many of their classes taught outside unless the temperature is too cold (less than -20 Celsius) or there is heavy rain.

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather and temperature. Please consider sending a change of clothing so that your child is comfortable in class in case they get wet.

If possible please place your child's name in any extra clothing brought to school so that if it is lost or misplaced we can return it to its owner. Especially inside sneakers, boots, jackets and hoodies.

Safe Arrival & Attendance

September, 2021

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In ASD-S one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we have introduced a **new**, **more efficient** student absence reporting system called **Safe Arrival**. This new system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With **Safe Arrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

1. Using your mobile device, download and install the **SchoolMessenger app** from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.

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2. Use the Safe Arrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.

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3. Call the toll-free number 1-833-219-9065 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

In addition, we will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **Safe Arrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.

Starting September 9th, please report absences in advance using Safe Arrival instead of calling/emailing the school.
