"On Tuesday interviews were conducted for the principal position at RHS to replace Christina who will be the Principal at SJHS next year. The successful applicant is Beverlee MacDonald – Beverlee is currently a one year Acting VP at KVHS, on leave from her VP role at Harbour View High School in Saint John where she was from 2018 – 2021.
