## **Principal's Report**:

- I will start with a feel-good story. We have a student who has struggled over the years. They come from a low-income family. This student was having some jaw pain and a local dentist stepped up to help. They have given the student Invisalign. The student has also secured at least \$20,000 for UNB.
- Student fees will remain the same. We are lower than other schools in the area but don't feel like we need to up that fee yet. It is currently \$35 for grade 9 students and \$25 for 10-12. Since going cashless, we have received an increase in student fees. We also required students to pay the student fee before attending the Winter Formal.
- BYOD- still working to have teachers and students have access to wireless internet throughout the school. Shane Kelbaugh has stepped up to help speed up the process.
- ELPA results are not in yet.
- Vaping: we have issued 3 tickets at \$172.50 from the police and have seen a decrease in vaping in the school. Linda mentioned maybe have a "3 strikes and you're out" rule for vaping on school busses.

- Sandbagging: last week the students filled sandbags to help with the flooding in the area. The Governor General arrived at the school on Friday.
