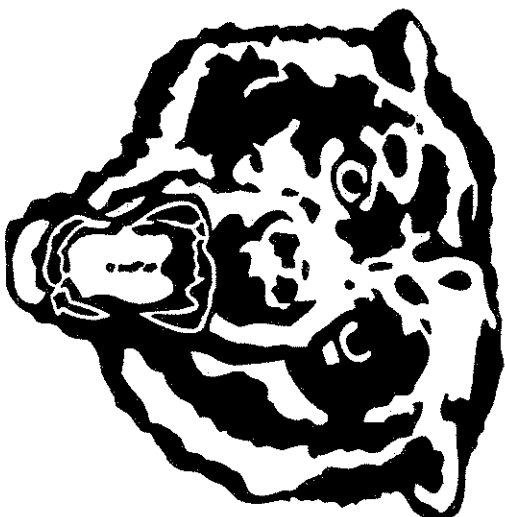

Sign-In / Sign-Out Policies

Students are required to sign-in at the office if arriving after 8:35am or are returning to school during the day. **Students who are signing out before the end of the day require an adult to come into the main office and sign the student out.** School staff will need to speak with a parent/guardian if someone other than the two contact persons listed on the Student Information Form is picking the student up. We thank you for your cooperation.

Student Safety

There is a buzzer/camera at the front doors for all visitors to use. The doors will be locked during the school day and monitored by the Administrative Assistant. Please use the buzzer to speak with the someone for entry. We appreciate your patience as we may be serving other parents and/or students at the time of your arrival.

Visitors are reminded to report directly to the office upon entry into the building. If you need to deliver an item to your child, the administrative assistant will take care of that for you. If you need to speak to your child directly, she will page your child to the office. Please **do not** go directly to your child's class as it is disruptive to the learning and poses a safety concern to students and teachers.

Attendance Matters!

In the event of an absence, please contact our Administrative Assistant at 849-5515 or provide a written excuse explaining the absence. Students are responsible to speak with each of the teachers of the subjects they have missed during their absence, and to catch up on any work.

Electronic Devices

Cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be used during instructional time. Please do not call your child on their cell phone. Please use our main office phone to speak with your child. Students can use their devices to play games during break and lunch hours. Your child is responsible for the care and location of their electronic device at all times.

Lockers

Each student will have access to a locker and a combination lock. It is imperative students do not share their locker combinations with other students. Each student is responsible for the organization and cleanliness of their locker.
