The student must conduct him/herself in an appropriate manner, remembering that as a member of a school team or club, the student represents him/herself, the student body, the school and the district. Consequently, the student, as well as the coaches, parents and spectators are reminded that school rules apply in the following circumstances:
- a.) The time before, during and after a game/practice or activity while still on school property used by the school for a game/ practice or activity.
- b.) The time traveling to and from a school trip when the student is traveling as a group such as the case with a bus, van, or school-approved drivers.
- c.) The time before, after, or between school activities, when under the care of coaches or supervisors in such places as restaurants, shopping malls, stores or similar places of business or recreation.
- d.) At all times (24 hours per day) when students are on overnight trips or similar extended trips.
- 3. There is no guarantee that all players/participants will receive equal playing time or positions of responsibility. The coach/supervisor will consider the participant's ability as well as his/her individual role with respect to the overall performance of the group's goals.
