Welcome F.E.S. families to the opening of what promises to be a wonderful school year! The entire staff is looking forward to working with you, as partners, in your child's education. The staff of F.E.S. is dedicated to providing a safe, nurturing environment in which our students can grow academically, emotionally, and socially. Good communication between home and school is key to the well being of our children.

We have many new faces on staff at F.E.S. this year. We would like to welcome Mary Ellen Veale and Christine Reevey to our kindergarten team. They have job shared in kindergarten for a number of years at Seawood School in Saint John. At the grade two level, we welcome Julie Urguhart. Julie also comes to us from the former district 8; her most recent role was a literacy mentor. At the grade three level we have two new faces. Welcome to Tracy Comeau who comes to us from Kennebecasis Park Elementary. Tracy has taught a variety of grades within the former district six. Also at grade 3, we welcome Candace Arbeau. A few things to make our year go more smoothly - first, **call the Safe Arrival** number at 847-2087 if your son or daughter is going to be absent from school. This line is available 24 hours a day so if you are up in the night with a sick child and do not want to awaken in the morning, take a minute to call. It is an automated system so please follow the prompts. The purpose of this program is to ensure the safety of all children. If a child is not accounted for at school, we want to make sure they are at home safely with you.

Second, please follow our drop off procedures if your child is not coming to school via bus. The lane in front of the school is a **bus only**. All parents dropping off their children will have three options:

Park at the far end of Dream Land and have your child(ren) use the sidewalk and en ter through the playground gate.

Use the revised drop off lane and have your children enter through the newest gate at the end of the school opposite the grade five door.

Use the drop off circle in front of the school closest to the main entrance. Children will then proceed to the playground using the sidewalk parallel to the school. *This circle is for drop off only. No parking permitted in this circle.*

The first eight parking spots in front of Dream Land will be designated 'No Parking' from 7:30 - 8:30 to eliminate vehicles backing into the flow of traffic. Doing a U Turn in this area will now be permitted to access the drop off zone.

Fall Running Club

Our grade 3, 4, 5 fall running club will start on September 23rd. It will be on Mondays for grade 4, Wednesdays for grade 3, and Fridays for grade 5. Interested students run between 1 and 4 kms every week. Thank you to those parents who are able to help out.

- 7. Sharpen the saw


School Fees 2013-2014

Literacy

Here are a few ideas to make literacy a part of your family's busy day:

- Write and read Messages; Have your child leave messages on a message pad or white board. Leave your child a message to be read.
- Play "Can You Read My Mind?" I'm thinking of something to eat that rhymes with seat. We're having i-c-e cream for dessert. What are we having?
- **Shop:** Make a shopping list together. Have your child read the list back did you forget anything? Take the list to the store and check off each item.

Play "I Spy"; I spy a person whose name ends with a _____ sound.

I spy a fruit that starts with the letter "b."

Numeracy How will your child learn math?

Children learn math best through activities that encourage them to:

- explore
- think about what they are exploring
- solve problems using information they have gathered themselves
- explain how they reached their solutions

22-11=?

Children learn easily when they can connect math concepts and procedures to their own experience. By using common household objects (such as measuring cups and spoons in the kitchen) and observing everyday events (such as weather patterns over the course of a week), they can "see" the ideas that are being taught.

An important part of learning math is learning how to solve problems. Children are encouraged to use trial and error to develop their ability to reason and to learn how to go about problem solving. They learn that there may be more than one way to solve a problem and more than one answer. They also learn to express themselves clearly as they explain their solutions.
