## Nut Free School / Allergies

Quispamsis Elementary School has several students who have been diagnosed with a severe, possibly life-threatening allergy to peanuts and/or nuts and peanut/nut products. Exposure to even a very tiny amount of this allergen can cause anaphylactic shock which could result in throat tightness or closing, loss of consciousness *and*, *possibly*, *death*. Because peanuts and nut products are such a threat to the safety of these children, it's essential that the *entire* QES community takes seriously the need to eliminate them from the school.

We have informed all families that we are a Nut Free School with the intention of keeping peanuts and nut products completely out of the schools. We thank you for your cooperation with complying with this policy to ensure our students with severe allergies come to school feeling safe and secure. It is important to remind your child that we do not permit food trading due to risks associated with serious allergies. Students know that the food packed from home is safe so that is what we must eat at school.

### HOME AND SCHOOL AND PSSC

Another year is starting which means our parent volunteer groups are getting into full swing. We have several new members to our committee so we wanted to introduce them to our school community. ## HEALTHY FOOD POLICY-711

The Province of New Brunswick has rolled out an updated policy called the Healthier School Food Environment Policy. At QES, we are working with an amazing group of volunteers as schools transition towards these new guidelines and as clarification on expectations for school develop. Our current school programs include:

<u>Breakfast Program</u> - an all inclusive program offered each morning at the school in our music room to provide students a nutritious breakfast. Students participate in this program where there is no stigma attached.

<u>A La Carte Program</u> - formerly known as "Hot Lunch" and we will continue to work towards meal options for students that fit within the guidelines of the new policy and several improvements have been made for this fall and we thank our Home and School for all their hard work on behalf of our families.

<u>Noodle Club</u> - is a lunch program offered once a week based on referrals from teachers to our school community coordinator and offered in partnership with Kings Church. Students learn valuable life skills while enjoying
