





1 – Four times within a month

Four times within a month that is not identified with an appropriate excuse(s) such as medical appointments

2 – Notification will be sent home for the following tardiness (see #1)

The letter will have an explanation of Chronic Tardiness and identifying the importance of instructional time and how tardiness causes class disruption; e-class documentation attached for support

3- If pattern continues a second letter will be sent home

The letter will be supported with e-class documentation and student's tardiness will be documented as missing ½ day
