Guidance Corner

Dear DATL Families,

Over the last few weeks, Java and I have visited K-2 classes to deliver an introductory lesson from the Kids in the Know program. During our first visit the lesson focused on identifying and labelling feelings and understanding that all feelings are okay, but not all behaviors are appropriate. We also discussed the grown-ups we can talk to if we need help.

The goals of this program are:

- To teach children effective personal safety strategies.
- To build resiliency skills (i.e. assertiveness, self-awareness, social-emotional competence, problem-solving, critical thinking, and low-risk choice making skills).
- To encourage children to report concerning experiences and behaviours.
- To provide messaging to those who have experienced abuse that they are not to blame.
