2019 Literacy Week at Leatherbarrow -January 21 to 25

Taking time to read or do a learning activity at home with your family is important every day. Then, on one special day every year, Family Literacy is celebrated across Canada. Friday, January 26, is Family Literacy Day! Family literacy refers to the many ways families develop, use and encourage literacy skills, such as enjoying a storybook together, playing word games, singing songs, writing a note to a relative or friend, making a list, or using a recipe.

We have many reasons to celebrate Family Literacy Day:

- Reading aloud to children develops their listening skills, vocabulary and language skills, imagination and creativity (*Family Literacy Foundation*);

- Creating a culture of learning at home encourages an exchange of ideas, enriches family relationships, and bolsters confidence and independent thinking;

Guidance Corner

Welcome back students! The holiday season has come to a close and now we can all get back to a slower, predictable routine at home and at school. January Guidance lessons will continue to focus on how our brains respond to excitement and stress. We are working on strategies for quieting our minds to develop self regulation skills and to improve our ability to absorb information. All classes are being introduced to a breathing exercise called, "Core Practice". This simple exercise requires students to position themselves comfortably and focus their attention on a resonating sound (we've been using the ding of a triangle) followed by deep breathing for a few focused moments. Core practice will be used for the rest of the year to help students settle their bodies and focus their minds in preparation for learning. It can be practiced at home as well!

Several small groups and clubs are happening on a regular basis through Guidance.
