This year's theme for Family Literacy day is "Celebrate Your Heritage" encouraging families to find ways to connect, play and listen.


As this week approaches, children might start thinking about what they would like to wear on our "Dress Up As Your Favourite Book Character" day on Wednesday, January 25th.
