

## Guidance Corner



#### Hello DATL families,

During guidance classes in February, I was glad to hear the students use the vocabulary learned during our Zones of Regulation lessons to help describe their feelings. I encourage you to continue reinforcing our guidance lessons, by asking your child what zone they are in, and what feelings they are experiencing. I have included a summary of key emotions found within each zone.

Students learned that experiencing feelings in each zone is ok, and that they have the ability and control to emotionally self-regulate. In February, we explored the Blue and Yellow Zones' toolboxes. This included teaching students the strategies to help move between the zones, to ultimately self-regulate (Green Zone). These tools included: deep breathing, star breathing, talking to a friend or adult, and positive visualization. I encourage you to remind your child to use these strategies at home. Looking ahead to March, I will continue to work with students as they learn to emotionally self-regulate by building their own toolboxes.

DATL celebrated kindness as well as Pink Shirt Day on Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>. My guidance lessons generally touch on the concept of empathy – an emotion that was emphasized on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. Empathy has been shown to help increase self-confidence and self-esteem in children, improve mental health, promote social harmony, and reduce instances of bullying. Empathic children can develop deeper and more meaningful connections with friends, family, peers, and teachers. I will continue promoting empathy in future guidance lessons.
