Grammar Suggestions

Model Correct Grammar

Rephrase what the child has said with correct grammar and say the corrected portion longer and louder.

The child is not expected to repeat after you.

Example:

Child: He goed home already?

Adult: He went home already. She went home too.

Give choices

Example:

Child: Me want it.

Adult: Me want it or I want it? Which sounds better?

Emphasize

Choose a grammatical error that your child uses often. Use the correct version many times during the day and emphasize it slightly as you say it.
