### Guidance Corner

The month of October was dedicated to solidifying students' understanding of the Zones of Regulation, as well as various emotion-regulation tools. As a quick recap, we spoke of 4 zones: the Blue Zone describes when you are feeling tired, sick or sad. The Green Zone is the 'ready to learn' zone. You're happy, calm and focused. The Yellow Zone is when you are feeling frustrated, worried, or on the flipside, silly and excited. Finally, the Red Zone is when you feel angry, mad or very upset. The students should now know how to identify what zone they are in at any given time and know that their zone can change throughout the day in response to either a positive or a negative "trigger." As the students learned and explored the Zones of Regulation, they also learned strategies to help them manage their feelings in hopes of staying in the calm and ready-to-learn Green Zone. Deep breathing, taking a break, asking for help and talking to a caring adult are some of the strategies that were taught to the students. A mindfulness component was also incorporated into the lessons, where students were taught how to focus on the important things with love, as well as why incorporating daily mindful moments is so important.

Time was also spent teaching and reviewing the WITS program. WITS stands for Walk away, Ignore, Talk it out, and Seek help. It is truly heartwarming to see the students putting into action all of the things learned in class.

The Rainbows Program will be offered at our school very soon. This is a support group for students who have suffered a significant loss in their lives, either through divorce, death, or other life altering crisis. We will have brochures ready and available at parent-teacher. If you feel your child would benefit from this program, please contact us.
