- 2. Students will demonstrate continuous improvement in literacy skills.
 - All K, 1 and 2 students complete common assessments in reading and writing in March to determine reading and writing levels
 - All students literacy levels recorded on E Data Wall
 - All grade 2 student attend Elmhurst Outdoors Sugar Bush in March, experience used as comment assessment for Recount Writing
 - Grade 1 students use healthy eating to motivate students to write about the five senses
 - All grade 1 students participate in weekly Buddy Reading time
 - Grade 2 Boyle has pen pals at LES
 - All students are "full swing" into Daily 5
 - Volunteers/interns/co-op students continue to read with children every day
 - March Bookworm Award focused on Healthy Eating, and April focuses on Spring
 - Block 3 of Literacy commenced on April 2. Focus is on Grade 2 & Kindergarten
 - All students continue to have weekly school library time (thanks to parent volunteers)
 - Grade 1 students have Procedural Writing as their writing focus for April
 - Grade 2 focus on Report Writing and Reading Comprehension in April
 - Grade 2 Howe is hatching chicks as a motivation for report writing
 - Over \$300.00 raised from the Scholastic Book Fair
 - New sets of Magic Key books from Oxford University Press purchased for Literacy students
 - New netbooks ordered to support students' writing
 - Principal and VP Hosted meeting for regional Literacy Teachers on Thursday, April 4th
- 3. Students will demonstrate continuous improvement in numeracy skills
 - Numeracy Brochures sent home to all families on February 11
 - District Numeracy Lead completed school-wide numeracy assessments Feb.5-8
 - Department of Education sent new numeracy posters for all classrooms
 - District Technology Mentor provided in class technology PD in March to enhance student numeracy skills
 - All k, 1, and 2 students completed common numeracy assessments in March to determine whether benchmarks have been met
 - 4 students represented DATL at District Chess Tournament in March
 - New Chess Club for novice players started in April
 - MAD Science occurred twice a week for 6 weeks, serving 40 students
 - Math Enrichment offered once a week at lunch to kindergarten students
 - Kindergarten students are working on numbers 1-10, including concepts of more than, fewer than, as many as, numbers that come before and after, counting backwards and forward from any number, and dividing a quantity into two parts.
 - Grade 1 students continue monthly "Fun Math Friday"
 - Grade 2 students focus on using math strategies and addition and subtraction facts to 18

 - Family Fun Fitness Night held February 27th
 - Report cards sent home
