

Dr. A. T. Leatherbarrow Primary School PSSC School Improvement Plan Update November 7, 2011

- 1. Students and staff will learn and work is a safe, healthy and positive environment, supported by family, community agencies and groups.
 - Helping Hands Playground Committee received NB Arts and Cultural Award
 - Helping Hands Playground Committee Received Recreation NB Active Living Award
 - Mrs. Brenton received Physical Education Teacher of the year from her peers
 - New murals created for lobby featuring code of conduct and importance of reading
 - Each class has had a safety lesson on safe outdoor play and how to properly use playground equipment; all classes have earned their "safe play" license
 - Air quality tests have been completed at school
 - Water fountain tests have been scheduled
 - Celebrate/Bucket Filling Initiative begins, Assembly held
 - Kick off to Kindergarten to be held Nov.9th
 - Lunch and Learn begins for boys and girls, 2 days a week
 - Lunch Rotation for teachers begins
 - Monday morning boogie
 - Terry Fox walk held
 - Fun Fitness Friday on regular rotation
 - Guidance Counselor visits all classrooms
 - School Intervention Worker provides direct support to students with behavioral challenges
 - Volcanoes Group begins November 8
 - Roots of Empathy program begins
 - Friendly Helpers group starts
 - Donna and Andy musical performance held
 - Remembrance Day Ceremony being held November 10
 - Safe Arrival program up and running
 - Breakfast program feeds approximately 40 students a day
 - Avon/Regal Fall Fundraiser completed
 - Wellness Rep sends messages for staff every Wednesday
- 2. Students will demonstrate continuous improvement in literacy skills.
 - Provincial Literacy Assessment Results surpass both District and Provincial averages
 - 40 Grade 2 students receive direct literacy intervention (29 reading, 11 writing) for first block
 - Literacy Teacher provides classroom support to most classrooms and is currently working on modeling "Supersentences" with grade 1 classes
 - 30 students will receive direct literacy support from now until Christmas

- Weekly library opportunities are available to all students (thanks to parent volunteers
- Many volunteers helping students with reading and writing
- 24 students receive direct resource support from resource and methods teacher
- Intervention teacher working for the entire month of November with small groups of Kindergarten students who score low in EYE-DA
- School based team meets weekly to develop strategies and plans to support students; district psychologist and district autism specialists attend biweekly meetings
- Speech Language Pathologist works every Thursday with students
- All teachers attend PD on new "Word Work" provincial standards
- All kindergarten and grade 1 teachers attend PD on Language Arts "Look Fors" as created by the Department of Education
- Administrative Team facilitates District PD on grade 2 writing assessment
- "The Daily Five" continues to be focus of PD and student achievement
- Bookworm Award begins and is presented daily
- Squirrel Hollow Post published in October
- Scholastic Book Fair scheduled for November 16-18th
- 3. Students will demonstrate continuous improvement in numeracy skills
 - District Numeracy Lead, Kathy Wallace, assesses every student in the school to determine understanding of number
 - District Numeracy Lead commits to facilitating PD at monthly staff meetings: specific areas of focus include differentiation, assessment, web sites, math games
 - New SMART board purchased
 - Grade 1 students do rotational math Fun Fridays once a month
 - District math and technology mentors provided PD on the use SMART boards designed to enhance student numeracy skills
- 4. We will develop and enhance family and community partnerships. We will continue to improve communication with families.
 - New PSSC formed!
 - Several PSSC members attend District Information Night
 - Synervoice system being used to communicate information
 - Monthly newsletters and calendars sent home in hard or electronic copy and also posted on school website
 - Classroom teachers send home weekly, biweekly or monthly class newsletter
 - Home Hardware showcase set up to display student work
 - Parent meetings held to invited to review SEPs
 - Parent meetings held to review IBPs
 - Report cards go home on November 10, with Parent/Teacher scheduled for Nov.
