

Your version of the **OurSCHOOL** student survey measures 35 indicators based on the most recent research on school and classroom effectiveness. This report provides highlights based on data from 856 students in this school that participated in the survey between 27 Nov. 2017 and 8 Dec. 2017. The number of students by grade level is:

Social-Emotional Outcomes

Student participation in school sports


Students who play sports with an instructor at school, other than in a gym class.


- 37% of students in this school had a high rate of participation in sports; the Canadian norm for these grades is 43%.
- 32% of the girls and 40% of the boys in this school had a high rate of participation in sports. The Canadian norm for girls is 38% and for boys is 48%.


Student participation in school clubs

Students who take part in art, drama, or music groups; school clubs; or a school committee.

- 37% of students in this school had a high rate of participation in clubs; the Canadian norm for these grades is 39%.
- 35% of the girls and 39% of the boys in this school had a high rate of participation in clubs. The Canadian norm for girls is 46% and for boys is 32%.







Students with a positive sense of belonging

Students who feel accepted and valued by their peers and by others at their school.

- 57% of students in this school had a high sense of belonging; the Canadian norm for these grades is 70%.
- 59% of the girls and 58% of the boys in this school had a high sense of belonging. The Canadian norm for girls is 69% and for boys is 70%.




Students who have friends at school they can trust and who encourage them to make positive choices.


- In this school, 72% of students had positive relationships; the Canadian norm for these grades is 77%.
- 77% of the girls and 73% of the boys in this school had positive relationships. The Canadian norm for girls is 81% and for boys is 72%.


Students that value schooling outcomes


Students who believe that education will benefit them personally and economically, and will have a strong bearing on their future.

- 57% of students in this school valued school outcomes; the Canadian norm for these grades is 69%.
- 61% of the girls and 56% of the boys in this school valued school outcomes. The Canadian norm for girls is 72% and for boys is 65%.









Students that are regularly truant

Students who skip classes or miss days at school without a reason, or arrive late for school or classes.

- In this school, the student truancy rate was 18%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 34%
- In this school, the truancy rate for girls was 12% and for boys, 20%. The Canadian norm for girls is 31% and for boys is 38%.

Students with positive homework behaviours


Students who do homework for their classes with a positive attitude and in a timely manner.


- In this school, 45% of students had positive homework behaviours; the Canadian norm for these grades is 59%.
- 56% of the girls and 33% of the boys in this school had positive homework behaviours. The Canadian norm for girls is 68% and for boys is 50%.


Students with positive behaviour at school


Students that do not get in trouble at school for disruptive or inappropriate behaviour.

- In this school, 91% of students had positive behaviour; the Canadian norm for these grades is 88%.
- 97% of the girls and 90% of the boys in this school with positive student behaviour at school. The Canadian norm for girls is 93% and for boys is 83%.









Intellectual engagement composite

Students who are intellectually engaged and find learning interesting, enjoyable, and relevant.

- 49% of students in this school are intellectually engaged. The Canadian norm for these grade levels is 44%.
- 52% of the girls and 49% of the boys in this school were intellectually engaged. The Canadian norm for girls is 46% and for boys is 43%.




Students who are interested and motivated in their learning.


- 30% of students in this school were interested and motivated; the Canadian norm for these grades is 26%.
- 31% of the girls and 28% of the boys in this school were interested and motivated. The Canadian norm for girls is 26% and for boys is 26%.


Effort


Students who try hard to succeed in their learning.

- 64% of students in this school tried hard to succeed; the Canadian norm for these grades is 66%.
- 70% of the girls and 62% of the boys in this school tried hard to succeed. The Canadian norm for girls is 70% and for boys is 62%.









Skills (grades)-challenge

Students who feel challenged in their Language Arts, Math and Science classes and feel confident of their skills in these subjects.

- 64% of students in the school had scores that placed them in the desirable quadrant with high skills and high challenge. The Canadian norm for these grades is 52%.
- 23% of students were confident of their skills but did not find classes challenging. The Canadian norm for these grades is 22%.
- 11% of students were not confident of their skills and found language arts, math or science challenging. The Canadian norm for this category is 22%.
- 2% of students lacked confidence in their skills and did not feel they were challenged. The Canadian norm for this category is 4%.

Students with moderate or high levels of anxiety


Students who have intense feelings of fear, intense anxiety, or worry about particular events or social situations.


- 34% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety; the Canadian norm for these grades is 18%.
- 44% of the girls and 22% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety. The Canadian norm for girls is 21% and for boys is 14%.


Students with moderate or high levels of depression


Students who have prolonged periods when they feel sad, discouraged, and inadequate.

- 33% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of depression; the Canadian norm for these grades is 19%.
- 38% of the girls and 25% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of depression. The Canadian norm for girls is 22% and for boys is 16%.









Academic Outcomes

Average percentage in Language Arts

Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Language Arts class (e.g., English) were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.

- In this school, students' average reported mark was 83%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 77%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 87% and boys' was 81%. The Canadian norm for girls is 79% and for boys is 75%.




Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Math class were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.


- In this school, students' average reported mark was 84%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 76%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 86% and boys' was 82%. The Canadian norm for girls is 76% and for boys is 75%.


Average percentage in Science


Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Science class (e.g., general Science, biology, chemistry, or physics) were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.

- In this school, students' average reported mark was 83%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 77%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 85% and boys' was 82%. The Canadian norm for girls is 78% and for boys is 76%.









Effective learning time

Important concepts are taught well, class time is used efficiently, and homework and evaluations support course objectives.

- In this school, students rated effective classroom learning time 6.1 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 6.3.
- In this school, effective classroom learning time was rated 6.4 out of 10 by girls and 6.1 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 6.4 and for boys is 6.2.




Students who find classroom instruction relevant to their everyday lives.


- In this school, students rated relevance 5.4 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.7.


Rigor


Students who find the classroom instruction is well-organized, with a clear purpose, and with immediate and appropriate feedback that helps them learn.

- In this school, students rated rigor 6 out of 10.
- In this school, rigor was rated 6.2 out of 10 by girls and 6 out of 10 by boys.









Bullying, exclusion, and harassment

Students who are subjected to physical, social, or verbal bullying, or are bullied over the internet.

- 21% of students in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month; the Canadian norm for these grades is 20%.
- 18% of the girls and 19% of the boys in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month. The Canadian norm for girls is 17% and for boys is 23%.




Students who feel safe at school as well as going to and from school.


- 56% of students felt safe attending the school; the Canadian norm for these grades is 65%.
- 58% of the girls and 60% of the boys felt safe attending the school. The Canadian norm for girls is 65% and for boys is 65%.


Advocacy at school


Students who feel they have someone at school who consistently provides encouragement and can be turned to for advice.

- In this school, students rated advocacy at school 2.3 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 2.6.
- In this school, advocacy at school was rated 2 out of 10 by girls and 2.6 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 2.5 and for boys is 2.6.









Positive teacher-student relations

Students who feel teachers are responsive to their needs, and encourage independence with a democratic approach.

- In this school, positive teacher-student relations were rated 5.3 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.9.
- In this school, positive teacher-student relations were rated 5.4 out of 10 by girls and 5.4 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 5.9 and for boys is 5.8.

Positive learning climate


There are clear rules and expectations for classroom behaviour. Students understand these and teachers maintain high expectations that they be followed.


- In this school, students rated disciplinary climate of the classroom 5.5 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.7.
- In this school, disciplinary climate of the classroom was rated 5.8 out of 10 by girls and 5.5 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 5.8 and for boys is 5.7.

Expectations for success


The school staff emphasizes academic skills and hold high expectations for all students to succeed.

- In this school, students rated teachers' expectations for academic success 6.4 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 6.9.
- In this school, teachers' expectations for academic success were rated 6.8 out of 10 by girls and 6.4 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 7.1 and for boys is 6.7.










Advocacy outside of school

Students who feel they have someone at home or in their community who consistently provides encouragement and can be turned to for advice.

- In this school, students rated advocacy outside of school 5.4 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 4.3.
- In this school, advocacy outside school was rated 5.5 out of 10 by girls and 5.4 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 4.4 and for boys is 4.2.





Students who plan to finish high school.


- 81% of students in this school had aspirations for finishing high school; the Canadian norm for these grades is 84%.
- 88% of the girls and 79% of the boys in this school had aspirations for finishing high school. The Canadian norm for girls is 88% and for boys is 79%.

Students planning to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program Students who plan to finish high school, and afterwards pursue a trade or apprenticeship program.

- 16% of students in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program; the Canadian norm for these grades is 18%.
- 14% of the girls and 17% of the boys in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program The Canadian norm for girls is 14% and for boys is 22%.









Students planning to go to college or university

Students who plan to pursue a post-secondary education.

- 70% of students in this school had aspirations for pursuing a post-secondary education; the Canadian norm for these grades is 65%.
- 80% of the girls and 63% of the boys in this school had aspirations for going to college or university. The Canadian norm for girls is 74% and for boys is 57%.

Students are asked to indicate the language they speak most often at home.


- 87% of students in this school speak English at home.

Students who have repeated one or more grades at school since kindergarten.


- 9.3% of students in this school have repeated a grade at school.
- 4.6% of the girls and 9.7% of the boys in this school have repeated a grade at school.




Time student has lived in Canada

Disability


The percentage of students that have a Disability that limits their participation in school activities and learning.


- 17% of students in this school have a disability.

- 6.8% of students in this school changed school because they were expelled from their old school.





Percentage of students that answer 'Yes' to the question: "I have a Personalized Learning Plan:"






Students are asked:

"All things considered, how satisfied are you with your life as a whole nowadays?"


Results are reported as the population's mean score on a 10 point Happiness Index scale.








