Ends Policy #2- Literacy

Develop Comprehension Strategies

- OAC Reassessed in April
- Created packets for literacy teachers to assist with teaching the strategy of Making Connections.
- One day a week will be dedicated to incorporating reading comprehension strategies in all subject areas
- A common literacy assessment (reading and writing) assessment for each grade level 6-8 was developed to be administered in the fall of 2013
- Follow up lessons have been placed in binders for teachers to implement with groups of students after the assessment has been completed and tabulated

To continue to focus on areas for growth in writing

• Literacy teachers to continue to work on specific genres while giving feedback for growth in specific traits

Some kids are not successful at grade 7 Provincial levels because of conventions, punctuation

• All subject teachers to have the same expectations for writing, particularly in the area of conventions

Ends Policy #3- Numeracy

To improve mental Math skills-

• Math strategies that teach the thinking behind the math rather than the timed testing

To improve problem solving skills-

- 6 computers bought to help with Balanced Math programming and differentiation
- PLC to develop a preassessment to use in September that would check students' retention of the previous year's outcomes and give starting points for individual students

Catherine suggested we as parents need to encourage the kids to do a little reading and math over the summer holidays

Ends Policy #4- Differentiation

To use formative Assessment techniques to ensure that we know where individual students are in their learning and what steps we need to take next

Ongoing review of data to group and regroup students for work in specific areas or to help with teacher planning for next steps in their instruction

To provide choice in assignment completion that reflects different learning styles Netbooks purchased to assist with Math centers and varying abilities within groups Universal Lesson Design- continued focus in 2013-2014

- A. Tell Them From Me- Student and Parent Surveys- Focus for September
 - Communication about learning- no agendas- daily homework and assignment outlines to be posted on the web page
 - How my child is progressing in school subjects, social and emotional development??- What would parents like to see?
 - Student concerns were around the cafeteria, Catherine has spoken with the company to meet with student representatives to be heard and to also teach the kids a little bit about how the food service business is run
 - Parents concerns were around the report cards. They're designed by the province. Progress reports were introduced to try to bridge the gap between report cards. Was developed by parent committee. Catherine suggested next year we might want to try to think of some other way for teachers to communicate where students are socially/emotionally to parents. Laurie thought maybe parent concerns are a product of the transition in to middle school.
