Peanuts and Nut Products

Lakefield Elementary School has 8 children who have been diagnosed with a severe, possibly lifethreatening allergy to peanuts and/or nuts and peanut/nut products. Exposure to even a very tiny amount of this allergen can cause anaphylactic shock which could result in throat tightness or closing, loss of consciousness and, possibly, death. Because peanuts and nut products are such a threat to the safety of these children, it's essential that the entire LES community takes seriously the need to eliminate them from the school.

We have informed the parents/guardians of children with classmates with peanut allergies, with the intention of keeping

Arrival and Departure Protocol

The best location to drop off students is in at the back door of the school or at the path on Winchester. We ask that you use either the lower parking lot, near our front doors, at the path on Winchester or the back door of the school. Do not wait in either of our staff parking lots to pick up children.
