The ukulele program draws on all the music reading skills learned in the previous grades. We have learned the parts of the ukulele, how to hold the instrument, the open strings of the ukulele and have also learned how to play a simple Halloween song using one chord with some added percussion instruments. The process of learning how to play an instrument is not an easy task and takes time to grasp. Some students will find it easier/harder than others. If your child is having a difficult time this is completely normal. Please encourage them to be patient and time will remedy many of their difficulties. Much practice and repetition of the skills we have learned is needed before the children see the fruits of their labor. I have told the children that it is their attitude and approach to learning something new that is the most important thing to me, especially if they are finding it challenging. A good work ethic is more important to me than how well they play the ukulele, no matter whether the instrument is challenging or not. In the meantime, the children seem to be enjoying themselves.

In addition to learning the ukulele, we also completed a unit on the composer Edvard Grieg and his composition "In the Hall of the Mountain King". We learned a few facts about Grieg's life and through listening and storytelling of the Norwegian folk legend of Peer Gynt we learned the music of In the Hall of the Mountain King. It really was a lot of fun! Time is certainly flying by and we are now starting to prepare for the Christmas concert which is always an exciting time.
