

- 60% of the girls and 23% of the boys in this school had a high rate of participation in clubs. The Canadian norm for girls is 57% and for boys is 43%.



- 85% of the girls and 85% of the boys in this school had a high sense of belonging. The Canadian norm for girls is 87% and for boys is 85%.


























Percentage of students that answer 'Yes' to the question: "I have a Personalized Learning Plan:"








The percentage of students that indicated they were enrolled in French Immersion.





