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<u>Healthy Smiles, Clear Vision</u>: <u>Healthy Smiles, Clear Vision (gnb.ca)</u> is New Brunswick's dental and vision plan for children of low-income families. Implemented in September 2012, the program was developed based on recommendations made by the Advisory Committee on Health Benefits, one of three committees established to address key issues in New Brunswick's fight against poverty. To be eligible you must:

- Live in New Brunswick; Have dependent child(ren) aged 18 years old or younger
- Not have dental and vision coverage through any other government program or private insurance plan
- Have a family net income level not exceeding the following amounts found at the following link: Healthy Smiles, Clear Vision (gnb.ca)
