#### **GRADE 1 FI REGISTRATION:**





#### Dear ASD-S families,

When extreme cold warnings have been issued for New Brunswick, please note, that while outdoor activity is important in ASD-S, school staff will always use their judgment during the cold temperatures whether to keep students indoors during breaks or recess, based on the age of the students, playground/grounds condition, length of time outside, and the weather. Generally, temperatures below -20°C with the wind chill would warrant staying inside. We rely on our families to ensure their child is dressed appropriately for their travel to and from school. This includes:

- Warm coat
- Gloves/Mittens
- Head/Ear covering
- Boots or warm shoes
- Waterproof snow pants for younger students

We have many students who do not arrive at school dressed appropriately for the cold weather. If for any reason your child is not able to come to school dressed safely for the winter weather, please contact your child's teacher or principal and they can assist you. Many schools have resources onsite to provide students in need of clothing or will happily help seek out other supports.

#### STORM DAYS:

#### What learning activities can your child do at home on school cancellation days??

-Make MOON SAND together and have fun! ½ c baby oil for every 2 c flour or 1/3 c coconut oil for every 2 c flour. Store in air tight container.

-Build a BLANKET FORT! Use lightweight sheets, duct tape and clamps, make it comfy and grab a snack! -SCAVENGER HUNT-Kids will have a blast hunting for items!

-Make a TOY CAR GARAGE for your Hot Wheels (need a small box, paint, black Sharpie for details and your imagination)

-HOMEMADE BOOKS-Gather items for the bin that will entice your child to made their own books at home. Item suggestions: small squares of paper, coloured paper, hole punch, ribbons for binding, small

stapler/staples, stamp pad and fun stamp shapes, stickers, shape hole punches, coloured pencils,

pencils/eraser, sharpener, ruler, markers, crayons, glue and lots of pics from magazines. Make it special and enjoy!
