Picking Up Your Child Before Dismissal

If you need to pick your child up during school hours for an appointment, please indicate this in School Messenger before 8:30am, or email your child's teacher the day prior.

If this is a last-minute pickup, please call the school first.

SAFE ARRIVAL& ATTENDANCE

In Anglophone South School District, being present and on time every day for school is a priority.

Please note that we have many students coming to school late in the mornings.

If you bring your child to school late (after 8:10am) please come into the school and sign your child in at the office.

When marking your child late or absent please note the CODES below. There has been some confusion on these particular codes.

8:30am is the absolute LATEST time you can enter a code on that day. If you need to let us know of an absence that has not been entered, please call the school.

If your child is to be "late" because of an appointment please mark TARDY on the drop down list. You can also enter the reason in "comment" AND the time he/she is to arrive.

If you choose "appointment" - your child could be marked absent the entire day instead of half a day or just late.

OIP Other absence - PM

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
