Good evening, this is Mrs. Myatt with this week's weekly message.

Instructional Time: Our instruction time begins at 8:15. It is imperative that our students arrive at school on time so that they are here and ready for their daily learning.

Students who arrive after this time are considered Tardy, students who are not in attendance by 8:45 are considered Absent.
