In the event that a child arrives at school with party invitations, and some students are excluded, the invitations will **not** be distributed at school; they will be returned to you with a note from the teacher explaining why they were not passed out. ## Attendance Matters

**Did you know** that students can suffer academically if they miss just 10% of the school year? That's only 2 or 3 days a month. That can add up without you even realizing it. We want to remind our families that you are key to making sure your child gets to school safely and on time every day. Some absences, such as **sick days, are unavoidable**, but as parents and guardians you can ensure your child does not miss time for unnecessary travelling or appointments, and that if they are kept home due to illness, they are truly sick. If you struggle to get your child to attend, or to arrive on time, we encourage you to reach to their teacher. We're here to help.



Find you're running late in the morning? Set a regular bedtime and morning routine and aim for 9-11 hours of sleep for little ones. Try to lay out clothes and pack backpacks and lunches the night before.
