Dear ASD-S Families,

As we learn more about the COVID-19 virus and the state of the pandemic changes within our province, Public Health and the government of New Brunswick have maintained up-to-date safety guidelines and requirements.

Linked [here](#) you will find the latest, recently updated COVID-19 screening poster which is now displayed on the entrances to our schools. We ask all families and students to answer these screening questions to themselves before entering our facilities. Families with younger students should be aware of the screening questions and monitor students for symptoms prior to sending them to school.

Please note that the following restriction has been added to the latest screening guidelines:

If an individual in your household returned from outside of the Atlantic bubble in the past 14 days for any reason, and now someone within your household has developed one or more symptoms of COVID-19, no one from your household is permitted to enter the building. You should return home and self-isolate.

By adhering to the rules and safety measures requested of us by Public Health, we lessen the chance that COVID-19 will spread in our school communities.

Our students have been doing an exceptional job following the safety measures required of them and navigating the opportunities and challenges presented to them in this very different school year. We thank you for the role you play in supporting our students and for your patience and understanding as we all work together to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our community.
