In collaboration with staff and our Parent School Support Committee, SGES has decided to offer to purchase student school supplies in bulk for a fee of \$40.00 per student.

The benefits of this include:

- Schools are able to group order supplies.
- There will be increased consistency and improved quality between classes.
- We will reduce our school's carbon footprint as there will be less waste.
- As time goes on, non- consumable items like scissors won't need to be replaced as sets.
- This will be cheaper for families... we realize that in years past school supplies lists cost parents up to \$75/child.

Parents will need to purchase a backpack, lunch box and a pair of inside shoes for their child(ren).

The SGES school fee will be \$15.00 per student and this includes the agenda or home communication book. **The total for student fees and school supplies is \$55.00.** You can pay on- line and get a receipt through the SchoolCashOnline once you are registered. If you are unable to pay on- line, we can take cash or cheque payments. You may pay with either method at your earliest convenience. You can pay throughout the summer through the on- line system **but we would appreciate payment before June 25** to order supplies by September.

If you choose to purchase your own supplies, you are welcome to do so. There will still be a \$15:00 fee for Agendas/communications books.
