

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Lunch at SSES

After carefully exploring options to make lunch be a more positive experience for students, we have made a few changes that will take effect on January 13. These changes will allow for less congestion at the tables in the cafetorium, lower the noise level in that space, and generally make eating lunch a more enjoyable experience.

Every two weeks, a group of 3-4 classes will eat in their homeroom classrooms instead of the cafetorium, even if they are buying lunch. This will allow them the opportunity to have lunch in a smaller, more quiet area, and further develop the relationships with their class peers. Lunch time will continue to be at the same time, supervised as it has been during any "Eat in Classrooms" day. This will take place over the course of a 3 part rotation, meaning each class will have homeroom lunch for 2 weeks out of every 6 week block of time.

We will continue to work towards fostering a safe, comfortable and enjoyable lunch time experience for all our students.
