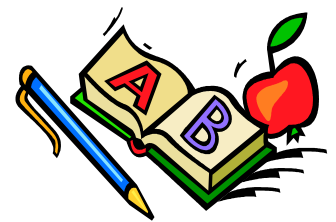
from wearing their masks during the larger blocks of learning time, and find this is helpful for them. Thank you for your role in supporting and encouraging your children with these changes at school.
