Mr. Yost's Counselor's Corner

Pink shirt day will be taking place on Wednesday February 23rd. This is an international day where people from all communities and backgrounds come together to take a stand against bullying. The original Pink Shirt day originated in 2007 and it took place in Nova Scotia. This event was inspired by a pair of grade 12 students who purchased and distributed a large quantity of pink shirts when they realized that a younger student was bullied for wearing a pink shirt to school.

Wearing a pink shirt and taking a stand against bullying is not just an outward commitment to not bully others. Wearing the pink shirt signifies that those who wear a pink shirt are actively taking a "stand against bullying". This requires both action and commitment. Based on research by stopbullying.gov, "bystanders, or those who see bullying, can make a huge difference when they intervene on behalf of someone being bullied." When bystanders act, they become "upstanders". Upstanders are those who draw attention to those who victimize others through responding directly in the moment and/or by reporting on behalf of the victim. Upstanders can stop bullying!

This week I encourage you to do more than just wear a pink shirt, make the commitment to act by being or becoming an upstander too!
