- c. Skating will wrap up before March Break.
- d. Grade 2 provincial reading assessment results from last year- How are we intervening with last year's students AND plans for this year's grade 2 students. We are working with both the grade 2 and 3 students in small groups, doing lots of different interventions.

# 4. Principal's report (information only)

- a. EYE-DA testing is mostly complete for our students coming in the fall. Another round of testing will be scheduled in the spring. Play, Learn & Go (intervention program) is happening at the school for 8 weeks.
- b. FAST finished up in the fall. We found this time of year to be busy, and that volunteers seemed tired and unable to fulfill commitment. Next school year, we will try moving the program to early spring 2016 around March/April.
- c. Family Literacy Night –February 12<sup>th</sup>. It was suggested to send out paper notices/invitations, along with the synervoice message. It was suggested to have a cereal bar at the event and eventually phase out the cookies next year.
- d. Report cards will be sent home on March 20<sup>th</sup> with parent/teacher/student-led conferences taking place on March 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. Once again a spaghetti dinner will be offered and the Scholastic Book Fair will be held. The spaghetti dinners seem to be catching on quite well attended last time.
- e. 'Parent Nights' Active Parenting workshops, Kids Have Stress Too, Budgeting 101, ADHD, How to Help You Kid With Math and Reading, Autism Parent Support Group
- f. Winter Carnival Week Week of February 23. The Kiwanis K-Kids Club is, also, looking at holding a winter carnival event on Friday, February 20. Mary Dow is to look into the Frozen
