I. Interpretation:

This policy means that the district will work to demonstrate continuous improvement toward meeting provincial targets in literacy, numeracy, science (English and French Immersion) and to improve learning in and application of the arts, trades and technology. This is a very broad statement and we are having an initial focus on building capacity within schools on balanced student assessment across all areas of curriculum and the second area of focus is having high functioning Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) in schools and Early Learning Centres. These two focus areas include all educators and are high yield strategies to improve student learning.

II. Evidence:

Attached is the ENDS #2 ASD-S Improvement Plan Status Report 2019, which lists the strategies that were adopted with the District Improvement Plan (DIP) and the outcomes achieved, those in progress and a statement about the overall "health" of the goals. All areas are on schedule with the exception of the Centres of Excellence with Early Childhood and this is a provincial initiative. As additional information, I have attached the following supporting documents which have guided our work; PLC Self-Assessment Tool, K-12 Formative Assessment Tool, and the PLC Improvement Plan.
