ENDS #1: Provide a safe, healthy, and welcoming educational environment for learners, staff, families, and partners

Joint Health and Safety Committee Training

First Aid Training

• Ongoing for all new-hire custodians, provided online, however we have held 1 session so far for those who were unable to do it online.

ENDS #2: Improve student engagement and achievement by embedding research based best practices in a variety of learning environments.

- November 3: 100 people attended Dr. Dan Chorney's presentation at Simonds High school.
- November 4: behaviour intervention mentors, social workers, and high school counsellors and administrators participated in a session with Dr. Chorney best practices to address school avoidance.
- November 30, December 1, December 5 ASD-S Administrators took part in Outdoor Learning Professional Learning/Warm-Up Activity at the ASD-S Administrators' Meetings.
- November 18, December 2, and December 9 Professional Learning days included a variety of
 professional learning opportunities for teachers covering curriculum updates and District
 Improvement Plan goals. These included outdoor learning, embedding technology in the
 curriculum, structured literacy, and embedding social-emotional learning outcomes in the
 curriculum.
- Bridging Program Launch was October 13, 2022, Bridging Meeting focusing on Indigenous culture was November 17 at Chris Saunders School.
- Bridging Meeting focusing Culture and Diversity was November 24 at District, Bridging Meeting focusing on LGBTQ1A was November 29 at Chris Saunders.
