ADMISSION

The summer school program is offered to students in Grades 8 to 12. To enroll at summer school, a student must have permission of his/her school Principal. In addition, students enrolling in summer school need a minimum mark during the school year of 50% or letter grade equivalent..

TUITION FEES

The tuition fees are as follows: EAL- \$200.00, Grades 8,9 &10 - \$200.00 for one or two courses; Grades 11 & 12 - \$250.00 for one course or \$300.00 for two courses. Payment may be made by cheque, money order or cash. **Cheques and money orders are to be made payable to “READ Saint John”. CHEQUES MUST BE CERTIFIED.**

DAILY SCHEDULE

The daily schedule is as follows:

Period 1: 8:30 a.m. to 10:20 a.m.
Break: 10:20 a.m. to 10:40 a.m.
Period 2: 10:40 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Students taking one course attend Period 1 or Period 2.
Students taking two courses attend the whole morning.

REFUNDS

A full refund of tuition fees will be issued by July 4 if:

- Summer School is cancelled due to lack of registrations.
- A student cannot be timetabled.
- The course/courses in which a student has registered cannot be offered due to lack of registrations.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

The following shall be considered sufficient reason for requiring a student to withdraw from Summer School without refund of tuition fees:

- Aggressive, disruptive, disrespectful or other unruly behaviour.
- Not working to his/her maximum.
- Absenteeism (for emergency, sickness, or approved absence only) greater than a total of two summer school days.
- Tardiness.
- Failure to do assignments.
- Truancy.

TEXTBOOKS

Textbooks will be loaned to students for use during the Summer School. Students who lose or damage textbooks will be required to pay the replacement/repair cost before final marks are released.

ASSESSMENT

Student achievement will be assessed in a variety of ways including assignments, tests, and final exams.
