Good evening,

Late last week a Calais, Maine elementary school confirmed that an individual in their school community tested positive for COVID-19. As well, we know that Washington County, the cross-border area that neighbours New Brunswick, has seen a recent increase in COVID-19 positive cases.

We wanted to let you know that ASD-S remains in close communication with Public Health and our Regional Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Kim Barker, as well as the Town of St. Stephen.

At this time, Public Health advice remains the same - to continue good hygiene practices, such as frequent hand washing/sanitizing; proper cough/sneeze etiquette; physical distancing; bringing two clean face masks to school each day; and monitoring for symptoms.
