What we are learning:

This week we will be review the Tt and Ii letters and introduce Pp and Nn. We will continue to work on recognizing and printing our names. In math, we will continue learning about Numbers to 5. We will say the number sequence 0-5 forward and backwards and will relate a numeral to its respective quantity. ("show me 2 bears"). Also, recognizing familiar dot arrangements to 5 (ie: on a dice). In You and Your World, we will reinforce the rules and routines of school. Mr. Campbell, our guidance counsellor, will also be coming to our classroom on Mondays (for 3 weeks) to introduce the students to the WITS program. It will focus on students trying strategies to solve their problems on their own first, then coming to a teacher if they can't.
