Talk Mail/Attendance Manager

The school will be utilizing the services of School Messenger for communicating with parents/guardians. This enables us to send messages home to the entire student body or to particular grade levels by phone and/or email. Please make sure that the school has current phone numbers and email addresses. In respect to attendance, the system will send out a message at approximately 8:45 a.m. alerting you to the status of your child's attendance at school. If a student is absent (unexcused) or late to school/class, you will be alerted by phone. To avoid a call on an absence of which you are aware, call the school with a valid reason for the absence prior to 8:30 a.m. Any calls that go out at 8:45 a.m. will be notifying parents of the status of their child at the beginning of the school day (Homeroom and the beginning of period 1). At the end of the day, you will receive a call notifying you of any unexcused absences throughout the day. Please contact the school immediately to inform us of absences so that we can enter it in the system. Excuses must come from the parent/guardian and not from students. These guidelines allow school administrative staff to manage students' attendance at school to ensure all of our students are accounted for during the school day.

Please note – If you have Caller ID on your phone and it shows Central NB Academy or 365-2090 then it is either a Talk Mail message or an Attendance message. If someone is trying to contact you from the school, it will show as Private call or PNB.

No Child Without Program

"No Child Without" Medical Alert bracelets are available for free to children up to age 14. Elementary schools should be receiving pamphlets soon which have the special PIN for coding. Meanwhile, families can call these numbers:

Students aged 14 to 18 can get a reduced rate.

Visitors

All visitors entering Central New Brunswick Academy are required to report to the main office immediately. Visitors are not permitted to roam through the building at any time without registering at the main office and are expected to follow all school rules. Requests for people to visit over the lunch break or spend the school day at CNBA will not be considered. Visitors who have registered with the office will receive an identification badge to be worn while at CNBA. These badges let school staff/students know that the visitor has received permission to be in the building. Absence of the badge signifies that a person has not registered at the main office.

Student Fees

A student fee of \$20 per student, or \$40 per family of three or more, is necessary to cover the cost of a yearly planner, rental fee for a locker and lock, exam booklets, school sponsored activities and I.D. card.

NOTE: Student fees are to be paid by September 30th. The student fee must be paid in order for a student to participate in extra-Curricular activities.

Sign-In and Sign-Out Procedures

To conform to the Anglophone West School District Policy (Safe School Environment), students will be able to sign-out of school once the school office has received written or verbal consent from a parent/guardian. Students will remain in class until the parent/guardian has made a personal appearance at the school office to take responsibility for the student and complete the sign-out procedure. ***Students may not leave the school without permission.*** Students arriving at school after the homeroom period has begun in the morning or afternoon must **sign-in at the office.**

Transportation

In the interest of the safety of all concerned, it is essential all students traveling on the school buses behave responsibly and follow the rules and regulations as required by the bus driver and the school district. Failure to do so could result in the loss of bus privileges. Students in grades 6 to 8 may only travel on another bus for child care purposes or other reasons deemed valid by administration. No child can travel by school bus to attend social gatherings such as birthday parties, sleepovers, etc. In order for a student to travel on a different bus or be let off at a different stop, he/she must present a note at the office and once approved, a bus note will be provided. A bus note from the office must be presented to the driver in order for a student to be transported on a different bus or dropped off at an alternate address on a student's route.

Due to lack of bus capacity, bus notes for alternate transportation will not be an option for high school students.

Peanut Free School: *Due to individuals with severe nut allergies, please refrain from sending any products with your child that contain or may contain nuts.*

Scent Free School. *Many persons are extremely sensitive to perfumes, colognes, after shave and other scented products.*

Please do not wear them at any time at school or on school busses.

Electronic Devices and Cell Phones

The staff at CNBA allow the use of Cell phones during break and lunch time. Other than these times, cell phones are to be turned off and kept in the student's locker during what is considered instructional time. Here is the schedule of use that must be adhered to:

- Upon the beginning of homeroom at 8:20 a.m., your cell phone is to be turned off and secured in locker
- Cell phones can be used during break (15 minutes) and lunch time. It must be shut off at all other times. Upon return to class from breaks/lunch, phones will be placed in locker.
- Cell phones are to be appropriately used. Cell phones that are used for cyber-bullying, communicating inappropriate messages or graphics, spreading gossip/slander, will result in the loss of cell phone privileges of the owner.
- Even though your cell phone may have photo capabilities, photos or videos are not to be taken at school during the instructional day.
- **If you become ill while at school and need to go home, it is extremely important that you make the phone call home from the office.** The Administrative Assistant/Administrator will need to speak with a parent/guardian to care for your needs and ensure that transportation home is secured. If this guideline is not followed, cell phone privileges may be revoked.
- If cell phone use interferes with the teachers' or administrators' ability to deal with a problem at school effectively, then privileges will be revoked. When incidents occur at school, it needs to be dealt with by school staff without outside interference. **Students should not be contacting parents/guardians before school staff have had time to investigate/deal with an incident.**
- **The use of cell phones is a privilege**, so make responsible choices to be able to maintain cell phone use during breaks.
- Other electronic devices such as I-pods, video games, etc. are to be used during breaks and lunch time as well. These devices are to be locked in lockers during instructional time; they should not be visible during this time.
- Cell phones that have been confiscated will be turned it to the office with battery in place. **Removing the battery is not an option.** A student may pick the phone up at the end of the day when consequences will be discussed.
- **In the case of high school students, cell phones or other electronic devices may be used during instructional time when the teacher deems them to have an instructional purpose. The teacher will inform you of the need to bring cell phones to class. These devices may only be used for the purpose/purposes prescribed by the teacher. In cases where this does not occur, the electronic device will be confiscated by the teacher.**
- **Refusal to adhere to these guidelines is considered defiance and will be managed as non-compliance to school policy.**

We are in need of PSSC (Parent School Support Committee) members. I would like you to consider offering as a candidate for CNBA's PSSC. The major responsibility of the Parent School Support Committee is to give advice regarding the establishment, implementation and monitoring of the School Improvement Plan. The committee meets approximately six times per year from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

The regular term of office for PSSC parent members will be three years. There is no limit to the number of terms a parent member can serve if they are re-elected and they have at least one child enrolled in the school. In order to ensure that the learning environment is focused on instruction, we need parents'/guardians' assistance in respecting the above guidelines and restraining from texting/calling students during the hours of instruction. The time frames below are ideal for making contact:

9:35 – 9:50 a.m. (Break for Middle School students)

10:40 – 10:55 a.m. (Break for High School students)

12:00 – 12:40 p.m. (Lunch time for Middle School students)

1:00 – 1:35 p.m. (Lunch for High School students)

3:05 p.m. (Middle School day ends)

3:10 p.m. (High School day ends)

Visitor Parking

We ask all visitors to please park in the parking lot and **not** in front of the school as it is a fire lane. If you are waiting to pick up a student, please wait in the parking lot area. .

From a safety perspective, if the Emergency Response Vehicles have to respond to a situation at the school, the lanes through the parking lot become Emergency Lanes. Therefore, we are asking parents/visitors to park in one of the parking spots as opposed to parking in front of the school or in the fire lanes when you are picking up students. Please do not exit your vehicle if you are parked in front of the building or in the lanes as this can be an obstacle to the safe evacuation of students from CNBA. Please keep in mind that over 200 students could be exiting the front doors in the event of an evacuation. Any vehicles parked there put students at risk of injury; therefore, vehicles need to ensure that the emergency lanes are clear to ensure the safety of all students.
