

Covid-19 Communications Report for the 2020-2021 School Year

INTRODUCTION

This report provides information regarding the communication efforts supporting the Covid-19 pandemic in the Anglophone West School District for the 2020-2021 school year. For the purpose of this report, communications encompass a variety of platforms, including the district-wide messaging system (School Messenger), Outlook email, website, social media and news media. Our primary audiences for these messages were families and school and district leadership. Key stakeholders such as the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD), the District Education Council, First Nations chiefs, community leaders, and Public Health were also provided with updates as situations changed.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- In ASD-W, 14 schools had confirmed cases, with three schools being affected more than once and three schools with potential exposure alerts.
- There were **16 Zone Change alerts**.
- From November 2020 to August 2021, a total of 80 emails were sent from School Messenger. A breakdown of the type of messages is as follows:
 - o Confirmed Case 46%
 - o Zone Change 26%
 - o Informational 16%
 - Vaccinations 8%
 - o Potential Exposure 4%
- The highest number of communications occurred in January and May due to confirmed cases and zone change alerts. In May, there were five schools with confirmed cases (out of 14 in total for the school year.)
- From August 2020 to July 2021, **335 Covid-19-related emails were sent from asdwinfo@nbed.nb.ca**, representing 30% of the total sent during that time.
- From November 2020 to July 2021, 1025 Covid-19-related emails were sent from the Director of Communications email address, representing 21% of the total during that time.
- There were 85 website updates made to the NEWS section of the ASD-W site.
- There were 55 social media updates posted to the ASD-W Twitter account.
- There were 55 media inquires from a variety of local and provincial reporters.



SCHOOLS WITH CONFIRMED CASES

There were 14 schools affected by confirmed Covid-19 cases, with New Maryland Elementary School, Townsview and Leo Hayes High School being affected more than once.

Eighteen confirmed case communications were sent in total, with more than half being sent in the last three months of school.

SCHOOL MESSENGER COMMUNICATIONS



All categories are self-explanatory, with the exception of the Informational category. Informational emails pertained to the following:




From November 2020 to August 2021, a total of 80 emails were sent from SchoolMessenger, with the highest percentage of emails pertaining to a confirmed case (37 emails or 46%).











As cases increased and zones changed, communications followed the same rise and fall pattern.

In January, there was a spike when zones moved into red and lockdown, and confirmed cases increased to three schools. In April and May, communications increased due to a rise in confirmed cases and zone change alerts. In May, we experienced the highest number of confirmed cases for the school year, which correlates with the highest number of communications sent out.



SOCIAL MEDIA

There were 55 Twitter posts made by ASD-W and multiple responses to inquires regarding the posts. For example:


WEBSITE

There were **85 Covid-19 messages** and updates posted in the NEWS section of the ASD-W website, which pertained to confirmed cases, zone changes, vaccinations and information updates.

There were 55 Covid-19-related media inquiries for newspapers, radio and TV.


Trending Themes in News



An analysis of trending themes, using the district's media monitoring tool (Meltwater), shows that "Covid" was the dominent theme across news media associated with the topic "David McTimoney".




Media Exposure



Meltwater's analysis of media exposure for ASD-W, the 69 district schools and David McTimoney show that the rise and fall of media activity closely mirror the Covid-19 situation throughout the school year. For example, you can see spikes in activity around the new year when there were red and lockdown zone changes and again in May and June when we experienced our highest number of confirmed cases in schools.
