
District Demographics August 16, 2012 On January 11, 2012, the New Brunswick Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development, Honourable Jody Carr, announced plans for a major re-organization of the Province's 14 School Districts. This action was taken to provide a more efficient and effective structure for schools to provide a quality learning environment for its students in light of the on-going changes in student demographics and fiscal accountability.

On July 1, 2012, the present School District structure consisting of 9 Anglophone and 5 Francophone Districts became 4 Anglophone and 3 Francophone structures.

Anglophone West School District (ASD-W) is the combination of School Districts 14, 17 and 18.






#### **District 14 Final Expenditures**






#### **District 17 Final Expenditures**

## Lincoln Elementary Community School

- Previous School was demolished Summer 2011
- New Construction on same site began May 2012
- The school will have 12 classrooms, library, cafeteria, gymnasium, music room, project work areas and break-out rooms between classrooms
- To open in September 2013

# New Northside Elementary School

- South Devon and Alexander GibsonMemorial moving into the new school
- New School to open in January 2013
- The school has 25 classrooms, music room, performing arts, break-out rooms between adjacent classrooms, project work areas, First-Nations room, cafeteria, gymnasium and multi-purpose room.

### Woodstock Area Schools

- September 2011, Minister of Education announced the capital for planning both new K-8 Schools in the Woodstock area. Schools identified as Southern Carleton Elementary School and Woodstock Centennial Elementary School.
- January 2012, Education Specifications were revised for the SCES K-8 project and committee met as a whole to review these changes and signed off happened in February 2012.
- February 9, 2012, the SCES K-8 Education Specifications were signed off by the SCES Education Specification Committee.
- February 23, 2012, the WCES K-8 Education Specifications were signed off by the WCES Education Specification Committee.
- February 28, 2012, the Education Specifications for both projects were submitted to the District Education Council for approval and it was granted. A letter has been submitted to the Minister of Education informing him of the DEC decision.
